What is context in this context? Ingredients of your social identity (who, what, where, when, why about you)





Race, age, ethnicity, gender, sexuality, disability status, socioeconomic status (includes access to healthcare), geographic location, education, family structure, hobbies, beliefs, career, experiences, etc

We are One and we accept everyone, right?



We are One and we accept everyone, right? When we understand our unique identities, we acknowledge and learn from each other.



Example:

Consider the different lived experiences of two women: a cis-gender white woman and a black transgender woman.

Both experiences are valid and true, both will experience discrimination yet very different in terms of privilege and social capital.

*Add nuance of socio-economic status, education, employment, etc



- Context creates perspective, depth, connection
 - It cultivates understanding and empathy
- It impacts access to equity, justice, belonging **(with self and others)

What does it mean to lead with self?

When interacting with individuals or groups:

- Awareness
- Curiosity and openness
 - Name and claim



What does it mean to lead with self?

In leadership roles:

- Relevant and relatable
- Demonstrate shared values
- Impact inclusivity through accessibility



Practical application in ministry

- Accessibility: spiritual, physical, financial
 - Belonging: specific over general
 - Impact: demonstrate Oneness principle



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Remove oppressive barriers; create resources; systemic change
